STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to a Fifteen-day Non-resident Fishing License.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 33, § 32, sub-§ III, amended. The 1st sentence of subsection III of section 32 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'There shall be 3 4 classes of non-resident fishing licenses.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 33, § 32, sub-§ III, amended. Subsection III of section 32 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding after the 2nd sentence thereof 2 new sentences to read as follows:

'A 15-day license shall cost \$4.50 and shall remain in effect for 15 days from the date of purchase. The amount paid on a 15-day license shall be credited on an entire season license upon the additional payment of \$3.25 in the same year in which the 15-day license was issued.'
