STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Operators' Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 19, § 48, amended. The 1st paragraph of section 48 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes, as amended by section 1 of chapter 247 of the public laws of 1945, is hereby further amended by adding at the end thereof the following sentence:

'Each license shall be issued for a period of I year from date of issue and no person shall operate any motor vehicle after the expiration date of such license unless duly relicensed to operate such vehicle.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 19, § 48, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 48 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. R. S., c. 19, § 49, amended. Section 49 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 49. Operators' licenses issued, only when poll-tax has been paid. No person required by law to pay a poll-tax in this state shall be granted a license to operate a motor vehicle until he shall present a receipt or certificate that he has paid his poll-tax in the town where he resided for the year preceding that for which the license is applied for or written evidence from the taxing authority of that town that he was legally exempted therefrom or that the tax has been abated. If a license to operate a motor vehicle is granted during the first 6 months of any calendar year, the poll-tax receipt or certificate shall be for the year preceding. If a license to operate a motor vehicle is granted during the last 6 months of any calendar year, the poll tax receipt or certificate shall be for the current year.'
