STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Use of Artificial Light in Taking of Herring.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 34, § 38, amended. Section 38 of chapter 34 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 38. Use of artificial light in taking herring prohibited; exceptions. No person shall take any herring for any purpose other than for use as bait by use or aid of an artificial light of any kind in any of the coastal waters of this state, except in York county and in so much of Sheepscot bay as is comprised within the following lines: beginning at the northerly point of Green Island; thence southerly by the coast line to the Cuckolds light station; thence westerly to Pond Island light station; thence northeasterly by the coastline to the northerly point of MacMahan Island; thence easterly to the point of beginning.'
