**AN ACT Relating to Taking of Clams, Sand-worms and Blood-worms in
Hancock.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Taking of clams, sand-worms and blood-worms in Hancock, regulated.
It shall be unlawful for any person not a resident of or riparian owner in the town of Hancock, in the county of Hancock, to dig clams, blood-worms or sand-worms for commercial purposes within the limits of said town. Any person taking clams, blood-worms or sand-worms contrary to the provisions of this act shall be punished for each offense by a fine of not more than \$25 or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days or by both such fine and imprisonment.
