AN ACT Refunding to Towns Fees of Retail Liquor Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 57, § 11-A, additional. Chapter 57 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 11-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 11-A. Refund to towns of fees from retail liquor licenses. All fees received by the state from licenses issued for the sale of spirituous and vinous or malt liquor to hotels, clubs, restaurants, taverns or retail stores, whether seasonal or otherwise, shall be held in a separate account on the books of the state controller. After the close of the calendar year, upon proper authorization to the state controller from the liquor commission, there shall be paid from such fees to each city and town the same amount of money paid by such hotels, clubs, restaurants, taverns and retail stores located in each city and town.'

Sec. 2. Effective date. The provisions of this act shall become effective for the calendar year of 1950.
