AN ACT Relating to Fees of Deputy Sheriffs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 79, § 166, sub-§§ XXXVII, XXXVIII, amended. Subsections XXXVII and XXXVIII of section 166 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes, as amended by sections 1 and 2 of chapter 313 of the public laws of 1947, are hereby amended to read as follows:

‘**XXXVII.** Every deputy sheriff and court messenger while in attendance upon the supreme judicial court or the superior court in their several counties shall receive for said attendance and service ~~\$7~~ \$8 a day; and the sheriff, at its opening, shall present to the court a list of the officers attending, with the statement of the duties of each; and the court shall determine the number necessary and disallow charges for others.’

‘**XXXVIII.** Every deputy sheriff while performing special duties under order of the sheriff shall receive for such services ~~\$7~~ \$8 a day, together with necessary incidental expenses, to be paid from the county treasury, the bills for which shall be audited as provided in section 2 of chapter 137.’
