STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Hunting and Fishing Licenses for Persons Over Sixty-Five Years of Age.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., c. 33, § 32, sub-§ X, additional. Section 32 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new subsection to be numbered X, to read as follows:
 - 'X. A permit to hunt and fish shall be issued upon the payment of \$2.25 to every resident of the state who has reached the age of 65 years. Such permits shall be valid for the remainder of the licensee's life.'
