**AN ACT Relating to the Taking of Clams in Cobscook River in the Town
of Edmunds.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Taking of clams in Cobscook river regulated; penalty. It shall be unlawful, between the 21st day of September, 1949 and the 20th day of September, 1951, both days inclusive, for any person to dig or take more than $\frac{1}{2}$ bushel of clams in any 1 day from all the shores or flats of the Cobscook river southerly of a line drawn from Gravel Point in the town of Edmunds to Leighton Point in the town of Trescott.

Whoever violates the provisions of this chapter shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$100, or by imprisonment for 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
