AN ACT Relating to Curfew.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 88, § 207, additional. Chapter 88 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 207, to read as follows:

‘Curfew

Sec. 207. Curfew for children under 16; exception. No child under 16 years of age shall be or remain upon any street, alley, highway or in any public place, restaurant or place of amusement in any town in the state after 10 o'clock P. M., unless accompanied by a parent, guardian or other person having the legal custody of such minor.’
