IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-NINE

AN ACT Authorizing Prepayments by the County Treasurer of Somerset County to the Law Library Association for the Purchase of Law Books.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Prepayments to county law library association authorized. The treasurer of the county of Somerset is hereby directed to pay to the treasurer of the law library association of Somerset county such sum or sums, not to exceed \$3,000 in the aggregate, as may be requested by the treasurer of said association and approved by the county commissioners of said county, for the purchase of law books for said association. The sums so paid shall constitute advance, partial prepayments on the annual payments to said association directed to be made by section 151 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes as amended, becoming payable after the effective date of this act.

A sum equal to 10% of the total amount of such prepayments theretofore made shall be charged to and deducted from the annual payment for the 1st year subsequent thereto, and a similar deduction of 10% of the total amount theretofore advanced shall be made from the annual payment for each and every year thereafter until such deductions from the annual payments shall have equalled the total sum advanced to the treasurer of said association as prepayments under authority of this act.

No obligation is hereby imposed upon the county commissioners of Somerset county to approve requested prepayments.
