STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Compensation for Members of the Boxing Commission.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 78, § 1, amended. Section 1 of chapter 78 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 1. State boxing commission. The Maine state boxing commission, as heretofore established, and hereinafter in this chapter called the "commission," shall consist of 3 members who shall be appointed for terms of 3 years and may be for cause removed by the governor with the advice and consent of the council. The chairman shall receive an annual salary of \$1,500. The other 2 members of the commission shall each receive a compensation of \$10 for each regular meeting which he attends. Each member of the commission shall receive a salary of \$1,500 a year and his reasonable expenses, including transportation, incurred in the performance of his duties. Any vacancy shall be filled by appointment for the unexpired term. The members shall serve until their successors are appointed and qualified. So far as is practicable they shall be persons interested in and familiar with boxing.'
