STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Licenses Issued by Boxing Commission.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 78, § 8, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 8 of chapter 78 of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter 213 of the public laws of 1945, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'All persons engaging in such boxing contests as boxers, seconds, managers, timekeepers, knock-down timekeepers, referees, judges and physicians must have been licensed by the commission in a like manner, such licenses to be subject to revocation or suspension for cause. The yearly fees shall be as follows: boxers, \$6 \$10; managers, \$5; seconds, \$2 \$5; referees, \$5; judges, timekeepers, knock-down timekeepers and physicians, no fee.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 78, § 8, amended. The last paragraph of section 8 of chapter 78 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Any person, club, association or corporation, or any officer of such club, association or corporation who conducts such a boxing contest, or any boxer, manager, timekeeper, knock-down timekeeper, second, referee, judge or physician who engages in or in any way takes part in such a contest, without first obtaining such a license, or when such license has expired

or has been suspended or revoked by the commission, or temporarily suspended or revoked by the chairman, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10, nor more than \$1,000.'
