STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Sale of Personal Property by Minors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 125, § 13-A, additional. Chapter 125 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 13-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 13-A. Purchase of personal property from minors; consent of parent necessary; penalty. Whoever buys any personal property from any child under the age of 18 years without the written consent to such purchase by the parent, guardian or other person having care, custody and control of such child shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100 or by imprisonment for not more than 60 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.'
