**RESOLVE, Providing for Purchase of Property Adjacent to Pownal
State School.**

Purchase of property adjacent to Pownal State School. Resolved: That the sum of \$15,000 be, and hereby is, appropriated for purchase of the so-called Florence E. and Alonzo G. Orr property adjacent to the institution, including a large dwelling, barns and other buildings, including hay, tractor and other farm implements, and approximately 75 acres of land, also, providing funds for remodeling; and be it further

Resolved: That this appropriation shall not lapse but shall be carried forward from year to year until such time as the property is purchased and the remodeling completed; and be it further

Resolved: That this work shall begin as soon as practicable and upon approval of the governor and council.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

It is believed this property can be purchased for about \$10,000. It is ideal for conversion into a duplex apartment providing living quarters for 2 doctors who are needed at this expanded institution, but for whom there are now no quarters.

The other buildings on the property can be used to advantage and the land is good pasture. We consider this a most advantageous purchase for the protection and necessary expansion of our institution, particularly, in the matter of providing good housing for additional staff members needed to take care of the increased population.
