## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-NINE

AN ACT Enlarging the Territory of the Parsonsfield-Kezar Falls Village Corporation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1911, c. 216, § 1, amended. Section 1 of chapter 216 of the private and special laws of 1911 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. r. Territorial limits. That part of the territory of the town of Parsonsfield in the county of York, embraced within the limits described as follows: Commencing on the southerly bank of the Ossipee river parallel with line of land of Sokokis Lumber Company and P. W. Benton west of Sokokis Lumber Company's mill; thence southerly near said line to include P. W. Benton's homestead; thence northerly and easterly through Kezar Falls, parallel with and 50 rods south of road leading through Kezar Falls to Cornish village to the road leading to George E. Davis' residence; thence due north by said road to the brook; thence easterly by said brook to the Devereaux road, so called; thence easterly a line parallel with and 300 feet south of Ossipee Trail, so called, a distance of 1,200 feet; thence due north to the Ossipee river.'
- Sec. 2. Referendum; effective date. This act shall take effect 90 days after the adjournment of the legislature, only for the purpose of permitting

its submission to the legal voters of the Parsonsfield Kezar Falls Village Corporation at its annual or special meeting to be held before May, 1950, and to the legal voters of the territory included in such grant. The corporation clerk shall prepare the required ballots, upon which he shall reduce the subject matter of this act to the following question: "Shall 'An Act Enlarging the Territory of the Parsonsfield Kezar Falls Village Corporation' be accepted?" and the voters shall indicate by a cross or check mark placed over the word "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the same. This act shall take effect for all the purposes hereof immediately upon its acceptance by a majority of the voters voting at said meeting. The result of the vote shall be declared by the corporation clerk and a certificate thereof filed by the corporation clerk with the secretary of state.
