STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Salaries of Inland Fish and Game Wardens and
Deputy Commissioner.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, § 18-B, additional. Chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 18-B, to read as follows:

'Sec. 18-B. Salaries of inland fish and game wardens and deputy commissioner. The governor and council shall determine the salary of the chief warden and deputy commissioner. The compensation of the other fish and game wardens shall be determined as follows:

On appointment as a warden, the member shall receive a salary of \$37.50 per week for a period of 6 months and \$40 per week thereafter for the balance of the 1st year of service; during the 2nd year of service he shall receive a salary of \$45 per week; during the next 2 years he shall receive a salary of \$50 per week; and thereafter he shall receive a salary of \$60 per week.

On appointment as a warden supervisor, the member shall receive a salary of \$67 per week, and thereafter he shall receive an increase in salary of \$1 per week at the beginning of each fiscal year for a period of 5 years, or until he has reached a maximum salary of \$72 per week.'
