## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Policies of Accident and Health Insurance.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., c. 56, § 110, sub-§ V, amended. Subsection V of section 110 of chapter 56 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - 'V. Unless the exceptions of the policy be printed with the same prominence as the benefits, to which they apply; provided, however, that any portion of such policy which purports, by reason of the circumstances under which a loss is incurred, to reduce any indemnity promised therein to an amount less than that provided for the same loss occurring under ordinary circumstances, shall be printed in bold-face type and with greater prominence than any other portion of the text of the policy; nor'
- Sec. 2. R. S., c. 56, § 110, sub-§ VI, additional. Section 110 of chapter 56 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new subsection to be numbered VI, to read as follows:
  - 'VI. Unless countersigned by a duly licensed resident agent, which countersignature may be in facsimile when used solely in connection with personal accident insurance covering travel on a common carrier issued through the medium of policy dispensing machines.'
