IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Relating to Pension for Chief of Police of City of Lewiston.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1939, c. 8, Art. XI, § 26, amended. Section 26 of Article XI of chapter 8 of the private and special laws of 1939, as enacted by section 12 of chapter 86 of the private and special laws of 1943 and repealed and replaced by section 3 of chapter 93 of the private and special laws of 1945, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 26. Pension provisions for chief of police. The chief of police, after having served 25 years ~~as such~~, or if permanently disabled while in the performance of some duty devolving upon him as a member of the department, shall be retired upon his petition; whereupon he shall be entitled to a pension equal to $\frac{1}{2}$ of the pay which he received at the time the disability occurred or at the time his application was filed with the commission petitioning for retirement benefits. Nothing herein shall be construed to deprive the incumbent chief of the years of service presently accrued as chief of said department.'
