STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Pasteurized Milk.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 27, § 83, sub-§ II, amended. Subsection II of section 83 of chapter 27 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'II. Pasteurized milk is milk, every particle of which has been heated in equipment of a type and design approved by the commissioner to a temperature of 143° to 145° F., and held at this temperature for 30 minutes, or to such higher temperature for such time intervals as the commissioner may from time to time determine, after which it shall be immediately cooled to below 50° F., and held at this temperature until delivered to the consumer. The bacterial count shall not exceed 25,000 per c. c.'
