AN ACT Defining Homogenized Milk.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 27, § 83, sub-§ II-A, additional. Section 83 of chapter 27 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new subsection to be numbered II-A, to read as follows:

‘II-A. Homogenized milk. Homogenized milk is milk which has been treated in such manner as to insure break-up of the fat globules to such an extent that after 48 hours storage no visible cream separation occurs on the milk and the fat percentage of the top 100 c.c. of milk in a quart bottle, or of proportionate volumes in containers of other sizes, does not differ by more than 5% of itself from the fat percentage of the remaining milk as determined after thorough mixing.’
