STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-NINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of the University of Maine for Law School.

University of Maine; appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated in favor of the University of Maine the sum of \$60,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1950, and the sum of \$40,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1951, for the purpose of establishing and maintaining a law school.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The University of Maine formerly conducted a law school. A law school is needed in Maine so that our boys and girls may receive a legal education within the confines of their own state. It has become increasingly difficult for Maine students to gain admission to out-of-state law schools.

The Maine State Bar Association has voted to recommend the re-establishing of the Maine Law School.
