STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Assistant Probation Officers and Clerk Hire for County of Washington.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 136, § 28, amended. Section 28 of chapter 136 of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter 139 of the public laws of 1945 and by chapter 317 of the public laws of 1947, is hereby further amended by adding before the last paragraph thereof a new paragraph, to read as follows:

'The county of Washington shall have 3 probation officers, one to be designated probation officer and the other 2 to be designated assistant probation officers. The county commissioners for Washington county shall determine and fix the amount of the compensation for such probation officers and for such clerks or stenographers as may be necessary.'
