STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Exceptions to the Admission or Exclusion of Evidence.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 100, § 123-A, additional. Chapter 100 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 123-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 123-A. Exceptions to rulings. Exceptions to rulings of the court upon the admission or exclusion of evidence shall be allowed by the presiding justice after trial, during or after the term, upon motion, within the time allowed for appeal or written exception.'
