STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-NINE

AN ACT Prohibiting the Procuring of Liquor for Certain Persons.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 57, § 69-A, additional. Chapter 57 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section, to be numbered 69-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 69-A. Procuring liquor for certain persons forbidden; penalty. Whoever procures or in any way aids or assists in procuring liquor for a minor who may not legally purchase liquor for himself or for any intoxicated person, pauper, insane person or person of known intemperate habits shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100, or by imprisonment for not more than 11 months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.'
