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AN ACT Relating to Trespass.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 118, § 40, amended.** Section 40 of chapter 118 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

**'Sec. 40. Trespass, by entering or passing over enclosed or cultivated land and buildings after being forbidden; penalty; arrest of offenders.** Whoever wilfully enters on or passes over the garden, orchard, mowing land, ~~or other enclosed or cultivated land, or other land~~ of another, ~~whether enclosed or unenclosed, between the 1st days of April and December or~~ **buildings, whether occupied or vacant,** after being forbidden to do so by the owner or occupant of said land ~~or buildings~~ or his agent, either personally or by notice posted conspicuously on the premises, is guilty of trespass, and shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$20. The owner or occupant of said land ~~or buildings~~ or his agent may arrest any person found violating any provision of this section, and carry him before any magistrate within the county where the arrest is made.'
