RESOLVE Providing for a Dam and Fish Screen at Outlet of Chain-of-Ponds, in the County of Franklin.

Old Burn Dam; screening of. Resolved: That the sum of \$12,000 be, and hereby is, appropriated from the funds of the department of inland fisheries and game, for the purpose of installing a dam and fish screen at the site of the Old Burn Dam at outlet of Chain-of-Ponds, in the town of Chain-of-Ponds, T. 2, R. 6, in the county of Franklin, provided that no funds shall be expended under this resolve until some person or association raises $\frac{1}{2}$ of the above amount and agrees to keep the screen free from sticks, leaves and debris.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The necessity for this dam and screen lies in the fact that pickerel and white perch are now present in great numbers in Flagstaff pond and Dead river. When the Dead river storage basin is filled, these fish will multiply and are very likely to over-run the whole Dead river water shed. At present there are no pickerel or white perch in the Chain-of-Ponds or other waters north and west on this same water shed and it is highly desired that this measure of protection be undertaken.
