STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Admission to Normal Schools and Teachers' Colleges.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 188, amended. Section 188 of chapter 37 of the revised statutes, as amended by section 41 of chapter 378 of the public laws of 1945, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 188. Applicants for admission, qualifications; tuition. Applicants for admission to state normal schools and teachers' colleges shall signify their intention to become teachers. If residents of Maine, they shall be entitled to the institutional programs without charge for tuition, and in return for which shall come under obligation to teach in this state for as many years as correspond to the number of years spent in normal school and teacher college training. The state normal school and teachers' college board shall charge \$100 for tuition to non-residents of the state and \$50 for tuition to residents of the state. It may permit not exceeding 10% of the enrolment of residents to pay their tuition charges at such future dates as it may determine.'
