STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-NINE

**AN ACT Relating to the Granting of Licenses for Certain Businesses and
Purposes in the City of Portland.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1915, c. 213, § 1, repealed and replaced. Section 1 of chapter 213 of the private and special laws of 1915, as amended by section 1 of chapter 160 of the private and special laws of 1917, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

‘Sec. 1. Regulation of persons and businesses. The city council of the city of Portland is hereby authorized to enact ordinances granting licenses and permits in all matters affecting public health, welfare, morals and safety for such periods of time and in accordance with such rules and regulations, not inconsistent with law, and upon payment by the licensee of such fees as may be established, and specifically including, but not limited to, the following: amusements, auctioneers, billiard and pool rooms; bowling alleys, boxing exhibitions, circuses, clam shucking and storage, dances, dance halls, electricians, employment agencies, the manufacture, storage, sale, transportation, disposition and use of explosives and flammable liquids, exhibitions and performances, filling stations, fish markets, freak shows, garages, hand carts and push carts, innholders, itinerant vendors,

junk collectors, junk dealers, lodging houses, menageries; merry-go-rounds, money lenders, motor buses having specified routes or termini, and the drivers or operators thereof, moving picture houses, naturopaths; organ grinders, pawnbrokers, peddlers, plumbers, public markets; rodent and insect exterminators, secondhand dealers, shooting galleries, sidewalk tanks and pumps, skating rinks, taxicabs, taxicab drivers, theatres, ticket speculators, trucking or ash collection, victualers, wrestling matches, and the maintenance of signs, flags, banners, awnings, marquees, and other temporary or permanent structures, excepting the temporary and permanent structures of public utilities corporations, over the sidewalks, roads, ways and streets of said city.'
