HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 1652, L. D. 960, Bill, "An Act Relating to Itinerant Vendors."

Amend said Bill by striking out all of section 2 thereof and inserting in place thereof the following:

"Sec. 2. R. S., c. 88, §98, amended. Section 98 of chapter 88 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 98. Persons exempt. The provisions of the 15 preceding sections shall not apply to sales made to dealers by commercial travelers or selling agents in the usual course of business, nor to bona fide sales of goods, wares and merchandise by sample for future delivery made by those who sell goods, wares and merchandise at retail from a car, wagon or other conveyance, steamer or vessel, nor to hawkers or peddlers on the streets or peddlers from vehicles.'"

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of that part of section 3 designated "Sec. 99-A" and inserting in place thereof the following underlined section:

'Sec. 99-A. Itinerant photographers, license. It is hereby declared that it is in the public interest to require the licensing of persons desiring to practice the profession of an itinerant photographer; and an itinerant photographer is herein defined to be a person, partnership or corporation having no regularly established place of business in this state who personally or by agents or servants goes from town to town or from place to place within a town soliciting the

making of photographic pictures or reproductions with a view to selling the same to the persons solicited; and it shall be unlawful for any person to practice as an itinerant photographer until such person shall have been licensed as hereinafter provided.'

Further amend said Bill by striking out the underlined words "state tax assessor" or "tax assessor" wherever they appear in any part of section 3 of said Bill and inserting in place thereof the underlined words 'secretary of state'
