COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S. P. 511, L. D. 1010, Bill, "An Act Relating to Liquor Licenses in Unincorporated Places."

Amend said Bill by striking out the 2nd and 3rd paragraphs thereof and inserting in place thereof the following paragraphs:

Sec. 21-A. Liquor licenses in unincorporated places. Upon-petition signed by 20% or more of the votors qualified under the provisions of section 64 of chapter 5 as legal votors of any unincorporated place requesting a vote on local option quantions, the liquon commission shall forthwith set a date, give public notice in the same manner as provided for notice in section 22, and cause a vote co be taken in such unincorporated place under its supervision. Upon petition addressed to the secretary of state signed by 20% or more of the inhabitants of any unincorporated place enumerated on the list of the state tax assessor and designated as qualified voters under the provisions of section 101-A of chapter 14, requesting a vote on local option questions, he shall forthwith appoint a time and place, give public notice in the same manner as provided for notice in section 22 and cause a vote on such questions to be taken in such unincorporated place under his supervision.

For the purpeses - of this election, - the - ormission shall prepare baliets and submit the same questions to such qualified voters of such unincorporated place as are previded for the local option vote in section 2 of this chapter, and are authorized and empowered to make necessary rules and regulations. for proparing, corrying out and determining the result of such vote. For such purposes, the secretary of state shall prepare ballots and submit such question as are requested

by such petition in the same form as provided for the local option vote in section 22, under such rules and regulations for preparing, carrying out and determining the results of such vote as said secretary of state shall promulgate. He shall promptly certify the results of any such vote taken to the state liquor commission.'
