IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to the Publishing of State Notices.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 1, § 34, amended. Section 34 of chapter 1 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows :

'Sec. 34. Kennebec Journal to be state paper; other publications. The Daily Kennebec Journal, a newspaper printed at Augusta, shall be the state paper of this state, in which shall be published all laws and resolves of a public nature and also all advertisements, notices and orders required by law to be published in the state paper.

When the subject matter of state departmental notices and advertisements is of state-wide import and interest, such notices and advertisements shall also be published in all daily and weekly newspapers as are qualified under the provisions of section 35.

When such departmental notices and advertisements are limited in interest to a particular section of the state, the notices shall be published in such daily and weekly newspapers as may cover the area or areas in the subject matter.'

Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is hereby appropriated from the general fund of the state the sum of \$25,000 to pay for the additional costs incurred under the provisions of section 1.
