AN ACT to Increase State Aid to Towns for the Support of Salaries of Teachers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 201, sub-§ II, amended. The last paragraph of subsection II of section 201 of chapter 37 of the revised statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 403 of the public laws of 1947, is hereby repealed and the following 2 subsections enacted in place thereof:

III. To each town whose superintending school committee submits a salary schedule, as a part of the aforesaid return, for each teaching position qualifying for an allocation under the provisions of subsection II of this section, a sum equal to $\frac{1}{2}$ of the salary paid in excess of the minimum as prescribed in said subsection II.

IV. In the event of insufficient appropriation to finance the foregoing provisions, the commissioner of education is authorized to make allocations to towns in the same ratio that total funds available are to total prescribed apportionments for teaching positions.'
