STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Definition of "Teacher" Under State Employees' Retirement Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 60, § 1, amended. The 5th paragraph of section 1 of chapter 60 of the revised statutes, as revised by section 3 of chapter 384 of the public laws of 1947, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Teacher" shall mean any teacher, principal, supervisor, school nurse, school secretary or superintendent employed in any day school within the state, including teachers in unorganized territory; also a teacher or principal of a normal school, president and instructors in state teachers' colleges, and teachers who teach in any school which is supported, or which has been supported normally during the previous decade, at least 3/5 by state or town appropriations or in the absence of such support, the teachers in which have heretofore contributed to the Maine teachers' retirement association, provided that such contributions have not been withdrawn.'
