STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Sales of Liquor to Minors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 57, § 55, amended. The 2nd sentence of the 2nd paragraph of section 55 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'No licensee, by himself, clerk, servant or agent entitled to sell malt liquor not to be consumed on the premises shall sell, furnish, give or deliver such malt liquor to any person visibly intoxicated, to any insane person, to a known habitual drunkard, to any pauper, to persons of known intemperate habits or to any minor under the age of #8 21 years.'
