STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-NINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Albert L. Winship of South Windham.

Albert L. Winship; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$148.29 from the general fund of the state to be paid to Albert L. Winship, of South Windham, as a full and final settlement for his claim against the state for damage to his truck stolen from his barn by escapees from the reformatory at So. Windham.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

On the afternoon of July 13, 1948 3 inmates of the state reformatory for men escaped from work assignments on the farm crews. At 11:30 P. M. July 13, 1948, Mr. Winship notified the reformatory that his truck had been stolen by persons unknown. When the escapees were apprehended on July 14, 1948, they admitted the theft of a truck in Windham. The truck was found at West Minot by Trooper Stanley Haskell. The truck had to be towed to a garage. The amount of \$148.29 is for rebuilding the motor and labor, the damage done while the truck was in the possession of the escapees.
