Further Amend said bill by striking out the last sentence before the emergency clause which reads as follows: "Amounting to \$23,165,923.00 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1950, and \$23,247,486.00 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1951" and inserting in place thereof the following: 'Amounting to \$25,508,212.00 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1950, and \$26,042,455.00 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1951.'
