STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to the Town of North Yarmouth School District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1949, c. 20, § 2, amended. The 2nd sentence of the 1st paragraph of section 2 of chapter 20 of the private and special laws of 1949 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'These 5 trustees shall be chosen by a regular or special town meeting as soon as may be after the passage of this act as hereinafter provided by a majority vote at a special meeting of the legal voters of the territory embraced within the limits of said district called, advertised and conducted in the manner provided in section 8 hereof.'

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1949, c. 20, § 8, amended. The 1st sentence of the 1st paragraph of section 8 of chapter 20 of the private and special laws of 1949 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'In view of the emergency cited in the preamble hereof, this act shall take effect when approved, only for the purpose of permitting its submission to the legal voters of the town of North Yarmouth at any regular or special meeting called and held for the purpose not later than 4 months after the

approval of this act of the territory embraced within the limits of said district at a special meeting of said legal voters called and held for the purpose not later than January 1, 1950.'
