STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-NINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Chester Blake, of Oakland.

Chester Blake; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$123.19 from the funds of the department of inland fisheries and game to be paid to Chester Blake, of Oakland, as a full and final settlement for his claim against the state for damage to a car, driven by him, by a deer.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This collision occurred on route No. 24 in the town of Sidney, November 20, 1946, and was investigated by Game Warden Lewis Johnson. The extent of the damage was as follows: One fog light, right fender and headlight damaged; right side of grille damaged; dents in right side door; fan broken. The car, a Pontiac coupe, is owned by Delwin L. Weeks but was being driven by Mr. Blake at the time of the accident. Mr. Blake paid all the bills for said damage.
