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**AN ACT Relating to Licensed Operators of Cinematograph Apparatus.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 88, § 67, amended.** Section 67 of chapter 88 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding thereto a new paragraph, to read as follows:

**'When more than 1 cinematograph or similar apparatus involving the use of a combustible film more than 10 inches in length is used for the continuous exhibition of motion pictures, there shall be 2 licensed operators in attendance in the booth or enclosure. When only 1 licensed operator is in attendance, it will be necessary to "black-out" during the process of changing over. While exhibiting motion pictures, the operator shall devote his entire time and attention to that work, and shall not leave the operating side of the machine while it is in motion.'**
