STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Sirens on Automobiles Operated by Fire Chiefs and Their Deputies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 19, § 32, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 32 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'No signalling device shall be unnecessarily sounded so as to make a harsh, objectionable or unreasonable noise, and no bell or siren shall be installed or used on any motor vehicle except that fire and police department vehicles and ambulances, and vehicles operated by state, city and town fire inspectors **and city and town fire chiefs, deputy and assistant fire chiefs** may be so equipped for use only when responding to emergency calls, and such motor vehicles used by deputy sheriffs, and such **ears motor vehicles** used by inland fisheries and game wardens as may be designated by the department of inland fisheries and game.'
