STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Pneumatic Tires on Motor Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 19, § 33, replaced. Section 33 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes, which was repealed by section 8 of chapter 104 of the public laws of 1949, is hereby replaced to read as follows:

'Sec. 33. Pneumatic tires; requirements. No person shall operate a motor vehicle, equipped with pneumatic tires, on the highway if

I. The wear on any one or more tires at any part is excessive; or

II. The first outer body ply of cords of a tire or tires on a passenger car or motor cycle is exposed all the way around; or

III. The first outer body ply of cords of a tire or tires on a bus is exposed on the tread all the way around; or

IV. The cords of outer body ply of a tire or tires on a commercial vehicle or trailer, having not more than 4 body plies, is exposed; and if heavier tires are used, when worn through $\frac{1}{2}$ of the number of plies in excess of 4 as indicated in the following table:

V. Any tire is cut to the point where there is danger of blowouts.'
