STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Right of Way at Rotary Circles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 19, § 77, amended. Section 77 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 77. Right of way at intersecting ways, entrances of private roads to public ways and rotary circles. All vehicles shall have the right of way over other vehicles approaching at intersecting public ways from the left, and shall give the right of way to those approaching from the right; except that traffic at rotary circles where the car within the circle will have the right of way over vehicles entering from the approaching ways. Traffic officers stationed at such intersections may otherwise regulate traffic thereat. The driver of a vehicle entering a public way from a private road shall yield the right of way to all vehicles approaching on such public way.'
