STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Penalty for Refusal to Work by Persons Dependent upon Towns.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 82, § 12, amended. Section 12 of chapter 82 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof a new sentence to read as follows:

'Any person who refuses to perform the employment directed by the town shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$20, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, for each offense, or by both such fine and imprisonment.'
