IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to the Sale of Intoxicating Liquors to Minors

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 57, § 60, sub-§ II, ¶ I, amended. Paragraph I of subsection II of section 60 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 163 of the public laws of 1947, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'I. Conviction of violation of any law relating to sale of intoxicating to minors, but a licensee selling to a minor believing said minor to be an adult after due inquiry and furnishing of fraudulent documentary proof purported to be issued by United States, state, church or municipal authority by said minor, may not be deemed a violator at the discretion of the commission.'
