**RESOLVE, Authorizing Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game to
Convey Certain Land in Eastbrook to Fred A. DeMeyer.**

Commissioner of inland fisheries and game, in name of state of Maine, authorized to convey certain land. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, in the name of the state of Maine be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to execute and convey by quitclaim deed to Fred A. DeMeyer, of Eastbrook, in the county of Hancock and state of Maine, the interest of the state in a certain lot or parcel of land situated in the town of Eastbrook and bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at the southwest corner of land formerly of Earl K. Jordan, now of the state of Maine, where it is on the common boundary between land formerly of Earl K. Jordan and land formerly of Fred A. DeMeyer, now of the state of Maine, and where aforesaid boundary line intersects the perimeter of the state condemned land as shown on a plan on file in the registry of deeds of Hancock county dated April 20, 1949, book 726, page 431; thence south 82° 30' east 2.18 chains to a post; thence south 27° west 28.50 chains to the perimeter of the aforesaid condemnation area and a stake; thence north 31° 14' west 3.02 chains more or less to a corner and stake; thence north 30° 11' east 26.09 chains to point of beginning. Containing 7.6 acres more or less.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The above authorization is requested because Mr. DeMeyer made an admitted mistake in approving the previous state of Maine land survey and subsequent condemnation proceedings. He now requests that we take less of his land, and inasmuch as we can still successfully complete our work without this land, the department of inland fisheries and game wishes to do all possible to maintain harmonious relations with the public in general.
