STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Overloaded Trucks.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 13, § 12-A, additional. Chapter 13 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 12-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 12-A. Additional penalty. In addition to the penalties imposed by section 11, the owner of an overloaded truck shall be punished by a fine of \$25. Upon a 3rd conviction of a violation of the provisions of sections 7 to 12, inclusive, the owner's registrations of all trucks operating within the state shall be revoked immediately by the secretary of state upon receipt of an attested copy of the court records, without further hearing. Upon such 3rd conviction, the owner shall not be permitted to register any truck in this state for 5 years from the date of revocation; provided, however, that after 3 years from the date of such revocation, the owner may petition the secretary of state for registration and the secretary of state may, after hearing and determination, issue such registration.'
