STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Opaque Substances for Windows in Motor Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 19, § 30, amended. Section 30 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding after the 3rd paragraph thereof, a new paragraph, to read as follows:

'It shall be unlawful to operate on any highway any motor vehicle which is registered in this state if the front windshield or the window at either end of the driver's seat contains any opaque substance so as to obscure in any way the operator's vision of the highway or any intersecting highway.'
