## STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

#### AN ACT Requiring Information from Banks to Institutional Service.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 82, § 44, amended.** Section 44 of chapter 82 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 44. Banks, etc., to furnish information. A treasurer of any bank, trust company, benefit association, insurance company, safe deposit company, or any corporation or association receiving deposits of money, except national banks, shall, on request in writing signed by a member of the board of overseers of the poor of any town or city or its agents, or by the commissioner of health and welfare or his agents or by the commissioner of institutional service or his agents, inform such board of overseers of the poor of health and welfare or the department of institutional service or his agents, inform such board of overseers of the poor or the department of health and welfare or the department of institutional service of the amount deposited in the corporation or association to the credit of the person named in such request, who is a charge upon such town or city or the state, or who has applied for support to such town or city or the state. Whoever wilfully renders false information in reply to such request shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$25, nor more than \$100, to be recovered on complaint in any court of competent jurisdiction for the use of the town, city or the state making the request.'
