STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relative to Recording Meters on Fuel and Range Oil Trucks.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 88, § 201-A, additional. Chapter 88 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 201-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 201-A. Trucks delivering fuel and range oil to have recording meters; penalty. All trucks used for delivering fuel and range oil shall be equipped with a recording meter. The said meter shall be of such a type that will record the number of gallons of fuel or range oil delivered to the customer on the statement to be given to the customer, so that the statement, of the number of gallons of fuel or range oil delivered to the customer, which shall be given to the customer at the time delivery is made, will show the exact number of gallons delivered. Any person, firm or corporation that shall operate or cause to be operated a truck for the purpose of delivering fuel and range oil without the same being equipped as provided in this section, or who shall violate any other provision of this section, shall be punished by a fine of nqt more than \$50.'
