STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Definition of, and Setting Traps Near Beaver Dam.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, § 100, amended. The last paragraph of section 100 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'No person, except as hereinbefore provided, shall molest or destroy any beaver dam. No person shall molest or destroy any beaver house or set any trap within 25 5 feet of the same. No person shall set or tend any trap within 25 5 feet of any beaver dam. A beaver dam is defined as a dam that actually maintains water around the house of a live colony of beaver.'
